CONCEPT NOTE



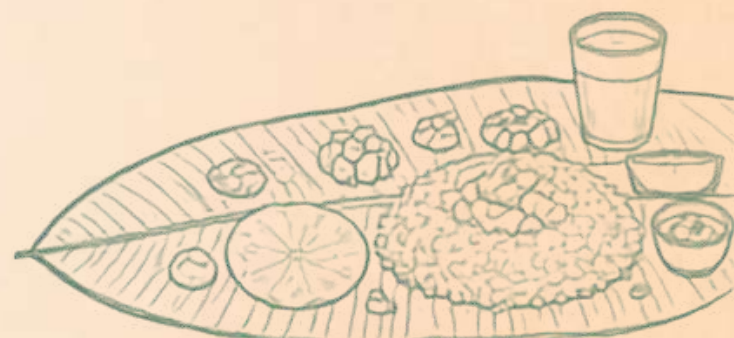
“Sustainability is not merely a response to environmental challenges but a way of life nurtured through culture, tradition, and everyday practice.”

Sustainability has emerged as one of the defining intellectual, ethical, and cultural imperatives of the twenty-first century. While dominant global discourses often privilege climate change, technological innovation, and environmental governance, sustainable futures are equally imagined through the practices of everyday life. Food, fashion, consumption, domesticity, and community engagement are not merely routine acts but complex cultural texts through which ecological consciousness, social values, and ethical responsibility are negotiated. These seemingly ordinary practices embody generations of knowledge, cultural memory, and resilience, revealing sustainability as a lived epistemology shaped by the interplay of tradition, creativity, material culture, and everyday experience. Consequently, the study of food and clothing cultures, literary and visual narratives, indigenous knowledge systems, and everyday practices provide a fertile theoretical ground for reimagining more resilient, just, and ecologically conscious futures.

India and Japan, despite their distinct historical trajectories, offer compelling paradigms for understanding sustainability as a civilisational ethos rather than merely an environmental response. India's traditions of community-oriented agriculture, indigenous food systems, handloom cultures, vernacular craftsmanship, and mindful resource conservation resonate with Japan's philosophies of mottainai (avoiding waste), shun (celebrating seasonal abundance), satoyama (harmonious coexistence with nature), minimalism, and repair culture. Together, these traditions demonstrate sustainability as a way of life, rooted in cultural memory, embodied through everyday practices, and nurtured through enduring relationships between people, communities, and the natural world.

Inspired by these shared philosophical inheritances, the conference seeks to create an interdisciplinary forum where food, fashion, and everyday life become critical lenses through which sustainability may be theorised, interpreted, and practised. It invites students, researchers, educators, academicians, practitioners, policymakers, entrepreneurs, artists, community leaders, and changemakers to engage in meaningful dialogue across disciplinary and cultural boundaries. Through keynote lectures, panel discussions, research paper presentations, workshops, film and documentary screenings, exhibitions, and collaborative networking, the conference aims to bridge scholarship and lived experience while fostering innovative partnerships and transformative action.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES AND IMPORTANT DATES

- Abstracts should be between 250 - 300 words and must include 3 - 5 keywords.
- Submissions must be original, unpublished, and not under consideration elsewhere.
- Abstracts should clearly indicate the research objectives, methodology, and key findings or arguments.
- Should be submitted in Word and PDF formats, using Times New Roman, 12-point font, and single spacing.
- Submit your abstract with the file name: **FirstName_SAC26Abstract**. (E.g. Irin_AbstractSAC26). For multi-author submissions, use the first name of the first author.
