# A. Academic Vision Plan

# 1. Academic Goal – 1

#### Action Plan

The Vision of the institution focuses on inculcating the values of truth and charity for the protection and promotion of human dignity and the preservation of biodiversity of mother planet. Rooted in the Principles of Christianity, the institution believes that the integration of Moral Values, Ethics, and Community Services to Academic Curricula would make the students ecologically conscious and better citizens of society.

# C. Infrastructure Vision Plan

#### 1. Infrastructure Goal – 1

To establish a Business-Hub/Research-Park in the campus to provide professional expertise for start-up activities to students, teachers, and researchers thereby transforming 'Ideas into Products'.

#### Action Plan

The institution would develop an integrated setup of space and machines for brainstorming, collaborations, expert interactions, training, designing, and realizing the Products from Ideas. The setup should be supported with different labs, tools, machines, and other basic and advanced infrastructure at a central level of access. The setup should be focused on supporting the Ideas leading to start-ups, patents, and other developments.

# 2. Infrastructure Goal – 2

To expand the Green and Energy Efficient facilities in the Campus

#### Action Plan

The institution would expand its initiative to be self-sufficient for electric energy and water consumption by expanding its Solar Energy Generation and Water Harvesting/Reuse Capacity. Sensor based energy saving controls and Certified Energy Efficient equipment shall be increased in the campus to save the operational electrical energy. Rainwater harvesting Capacity would be increased and Water Treatment practices would be deployed for increased reuse of water.

#### Action Plan

The institution would do the needful for strengthening eLearning and Hybrid Learning by augmentation of more MOOC and e-content facilities, eLibraries, eLectures, simulation based virtual laboratories, augmented reality (AR), and other eLearning content and facilities.

# D. Financial Vision Plan

#### 1. Financial Goal – 1
